

We have now opened seats up to guests of *any* age, so anyone is welcome to join us! There is a short essay students can write, which will help them have a very good chance at earning a \$500 scholarship through EF Tours. Likewise, there are concession stand opportunities (here at school and at UW Badger sporting events) to also help families raise hundreds of dollars to put toward trip expenses.

#### What are Dual Credit Options?

MHS offers several opportunities for students to earn college credit in high school. Several teachers at MHS or in the JAMBB consortium are qualified to teach specific courses that align with the curriculum at the college level. There are also some telepresence courses taught by college faculty.

Courses offered through Blackhawk Technical College should transfer with them should they decide to attend further schooling after graduation. If a course is listed in the course catalog as "Advanced Standing", those credits will only be available if the student enrolls at the partnership college. For example, if Animal Science 1 & 2 are offered as Advanced Standing with BTC in high school, a student will only earn credit for the Animal Science course at BTC if they choose to attend BTC post high school. If the course is listed as "Transcripted Credit" that course credit should apply to any school in the WI Technical College system and the Universities of WI due to the Universal Credit Transfer Agreement.

Courses offered with UW System schools through CAPP (Cooperative Academic Partnership Program) or CCIHS (College Credit in High School) should earn a student credit that is transferable throughout the Universities of WI, WI Techical Colleges, & often at private or public universities outside the system as well. <a href="Transferology">Transferology</a> is a great resource for finding out whether CAPP or CCIHS credits will transfer to the university you plan to attend.

Starting with the 2024-2025 school year dual credit courses will be a factor in determining weighted GPAs for high school students. The weighted GPA will determine class rank. More information on this will follow later in the school year.

#### **Tuition costs**

There is no additional cost to the student/family for classes aligned with Blackhawk Technical College or Madison College.

Students/families will need to pay tuition for CAPP & CCIHS courses. For 2024-25 courses cost \$110 per credit (i.e. a 3 credit course will cost \$330). MHS will add the cost of each class to the student's school fees to be paid during registration. It may seem like a large amount when registering for high school, but this is a fraction of the per credit tuition a student would pay at a university.

Financial assistance options for CAPP/CCIHS tuition available to students/families. Please contact the school for more information.

Historically the school board has incentivised these classes by reimbursing families 50% of the tuition cost for students who earn a 95% or better, which is great motivation for students to have goals for high achievement!

#### Why CAPP/CCIHS?

CAPP/CCIHS offer classes that immerse students in the rigor of university academics. Students will gain knowledge & skills that will help them jump into academics at college successfully, leading to less stress in their first semesters. Another benefit is that students have the opportunity to earn more than a semester's worth of credits, which can help them when it comes to registering for their college courses (less introductory classes to take, earlier registration times leading to a larger variety of classes available, etc).

#### College Credits (cont'd)...

#### **Student Requirements**

**Transcripted Credit or Advance Standing** - There are no specific requirements for classes with BTC or MATC besides meeting the prerequisites specific to the course (as listed in the MHS course guide). Students will only receive college credit for transcripted credit courses if they earn a 70% or higher or 80% or higher for advanced standing.

**CAPP/CCIHS** - Students wishing to enroll in CAPP or CCIHS courses must meet the following requirements:

- Class rank in top 30%
- GPA of at least 2.75
- Qualifying scores on placement tests (if required for that course)

#### **Enrollment & Registration**

All dual credit courses require enrollment in the partnering college, along with registration in that specific course. Teachers will assist with this process during the first week of class each semester. Upon enrollment each student will receive access to a student portal & email address for that college. Make note of the login & password because you will need this information when requesting unofficial transcripts, looking up grades for courses not taught by MHS/JAMBB faculty, or Canvas access for some courses. It is the responsibility of the student to inquire about access so they do not miss assignments & due dates.

Is it really October already? Hope everyone's school year is off to a terrific start! Couple of things...

**GIVING HAND WASHING A HIGH FIVE!** We are drowning germs by remembering to wash our hands with soap and water for 20 seconds, especially before eating and after using the bathroom. Elementary students did some fun activities and experiments learning all about germs and how hand washing helps keep us well! Ask them to show how we wash our hands in Monticello! And encourage it at home, too.

**FLU SHOTS** ~ The Green County Health Department will be coming to school on October 10th to administer seasonal flu vaccines to interested students. According to the CDC, getting an annual flu vaccine is the first and best way to protect yourself and your family from the flu. Flu vaccination can reduce flu illnesses, doctors' visits, and missed work and school due to flu, as well as prevent flu-related hospitalizations. The CDC recommends a yearly flu vaccine\_for everyone 6 months and older. Permission slips have been emailed out to all families ~ If you would be in need of a paper copy permission slip or can't find the email, please let me know.

**COVID-19 VACCINE INFO** ~ The CDC recently announced that updated COVID-19 vaccines are now available. CDC recommends everyone 6 months and older get an updated COVID-19 vaccine to protect against the potentially serious outcomes of COVID-19 illness this fall and winter. Vaccination remains the best protection against COVID-19-related hospitalization and death. Vaccination also reduces your chance of suffering the effects of Long COVID, which can develop during or following acute infection and last for an extended duration. The New Glarus Hometown Pharmacy will be coming to school on October 8th to administer COVID 19 vaccines to interested students. Your health insurance will be billed for this vaccine. You also should have received an email regarding this ~ Let me know if you need a permission slip for your child.

**OTHER IMMUNIZATIONS!** Every fall I complete our school's required state immunization report and audit checking on our students' compliance with required State of Wisconsin school immunizations. Thank you to parents for making sure your child(ren) are up-to-date on all needed immunizations!

**SICK?** We are working hard to keep ourselves healthy, but an occasional illness in kids that keeps them home from school is inevitable. Below are some reminders for when to keep your child home from school....

Where many kids gather, there will be germs! While it is certainly not necessary to keep your child home from school for every minor sniffle, there are some times when it is in the best interest of your child (and our whole school) to take a day off to rest and recover. Here are some reminders of when your child should not attend school due to illness:

- Fever >100.4: Fevers indicate a child is fighting off some sort of illness. Your child should be fever-free for 24 hours [without any fever reducing medications like acetaminophen (Tylenol) or ibuprofen (Advil)] before returning to school.
- **Vomiting or diarrhea**: Please keep your child home until he/she is able to keep down food from at least the evening before and breakfast that morning and no further diarrhea.
- Bacterial illnesses like strep throat, pink eye, and impetigo: Students can return to school after being on antibiotics for 24 hours.

When deciding if your child can go to school, use your best judgment and keep in mind that if your child is very uncomfortable, he/she won't be able to concentrate or learn. You may also want to call your child's medical provider or nurse triage line for further help deciding. Please remember to call the Pony Attendance line at 938-4194 to report when your child will be absent due to illness/injury.



Hello Parents,

We are excited to share that Orion Family Services will begin services at our school. A therapist will see students in our building during the school day. Services will be billed through a family's insurance and remaining balances are the responsibility of the family.

One of the amazing things about having SBMH in our building is that we have been able to get students counseling services in a matter of weeks not months. This has been extremely helpful to families who have struggled with waitlists. Another amazing piece is the increased ability for us to collaborate with the providers to ensure that students wellness is the priority.




